JUNE CAMPS

100: Lower School Adventure Camp

Students will then 3D Print their designs and watch in wonder as the object is created before their own eyes, layer by layer. From *What’s that Bacteria?* and *Mud...it’s ALIVE!* to *Plant Bingo!* and *Whose Scat is That?*, campers will learn about the organisms and biological communities that surround us while actively employing some of the modern field- and lab-based scientific methods that Dr. Coleman has used throughout his research career. In addition, there will be a visit from our Regional Park Ranger to discuss critical issues facing our local plants and animals, such as poaching, introduced species, and wildfires. Overall, campers will have a week of rigorous but FUN scientific instruction from Dr. Coleman, whose own passion for science was born and nurtured right here at SGS! You will come away with a deeper appreciation for how good science gets done and for the incredible natural resource that is our SGS Campus. Please bring a lunch and snacks.

JULY CAMPS

200: Rocket Camp

Grade Level: 5-8

Tuition: \$150

!!!Warning!!! This Camp Will Be Fun!!! Those who like to be amazed, enjoy smiling a lot, laughing with excitement, building really cool rockets, or just having a great time are strongly encouraged to sign up.

Have you ever met someone who has not been enthralled as they watched a rocket burst into the sky at amazing speed and followed the smoky trail until they no longer can see the rocket? I have never met such a person. Rocket Camp takes the student into the exciting world of rockets and lets the student see just how fun physics can be.

Students will learn how to make and do the following: rocket bodies, rocket fuels using ratios and weighing chemicals, experiment with different propellants, build rocket motors and test them, and recovery systems. The final project will be building a rocket based on the experiments they have conducted and launch it. Parents are invited to attend the final day and share in their student’s excitement.

A Safety Waiver must be signed by a parent/guardian on the first day of camp. All safety equipment will be provided.

201: Basketball Skills Clinic
